Ritual of Remembrance: Tolling of the Bells -

On this Sunday, we honor our past by Tolling of the Bells in Remembrance of five of our congregants who added richness to our lives at UUCV and the greater community while they were among us. We had services for some of them this year but wish to honor them once more. They are Earl Gunther, David Cowles, Del Allen, Belle Weninger and Gene Rouleau.

Earl Gunther was born April 29 in the depth of the Great Depression in 1932 in Bradford, Penn. and died April 8 of this year. He and his late wife Alice had been members since 1999. Alice passed away in October of last year. We welcomed Earl into the 90s Club in 2022. Earl and Alice were very active in the congregation. They renewed their wedding vows on their 40th anniversary conducted by a UU minister in Arkansas. Earl considered himself the luckiest man on Earth, taking nothing for granted. He came a long way from that scrappy neighborhood in Baltimore having enjoyed good health for most of his life, financial security, four thriving children and a loving wife for many years. He died just three weeks shy of his 92nd birthday.

Sally and David had two sons, Christopher, born in 1971, and Brendan, born in 1977. David was a kind, loving, patient, and smart man of many talents. He was resourceful around the house, and he had a great sense of humor. David loved to cook, and he raised his two sons while Sally worked. He also taught math at several colleges. David died unexpectedly on May 2 this year. His ashes will be divided for burial between Carson, WA and Bourne, MA. He is survived by his older brothers, his wife, his two sons, and five grandchildren. He will be dearly missed by all.

We were fortunate to have her among us for the last 28 years of her life.
